Love It When a <u>Family Emergency Plan</u> Comes Together!

The majority of Americans are not prepared! Pre-planning will help you your family better survive a disaster. A disaster could be: losing a job, family illness, fire or earthquake.

How are you going to communicate when we have a Wildfire or Earthquake? Does your family have an Emergency Plan? Does it need to be updated?

Here are some simple ideas to help your family start a **Family Emergency Plan**:

- <u>Plan</u> for the types of disasters that can happen in life. What if you lose a
 job, have a family illness, or experience a wildfire, tornadoes or
 earthquakes.
 - a. Where is your family "Meeting Spot"?
 - b. What is the communication plan if a disaster hits?
 - c. What is your plan to save \$ if you are ever unemployed?
 - d. Do you need additional schooling/training to advance your career?
- 2. <u>Create</u> your own personalized disaster supply list and there may be additional items you need based on your personal situation. For example, if you have infants you may need diapers, bottles and formula. Don't forget to have supplies in your car and at work.
- 3. <u>Budget</u> emergency preparedness items as a "normal" expense. Even \$20.00 a month can go a long way to helping you be ready. Buy one preparedness item each time you go to the grocery store.
- 4. <u>Think Ahead</u>. You are more likely to save money if you can take your time with focused and strategic shopping. It's when everyone is at the store right before a storm hits that prices are going to be higher. Use a list to avoid duplicating items when you are stressed or panicked.
- <u>Review</u> your insurance policy annually and make necessary changes.
 When a disaster strikes, you want to know that your coverage will help
 you get back on your feet. Renters need policies too, in order to cover
 personal property.
- 6. <u>Update</u> contact records. Have an accurate phone list of emergency contact numbers. If you are prepared, you may be able to help friends and neighbors who need assistance. By sharing preparedness supplies, you can help each other.
